Welcome to Honors Math 2! I have high expectations for you all, and I want you to know that I am here to help you learn and succeed. Remember to set your goals high, begin practicing good study habits early, and never be afraid to ask questions. You, your classmates, and I are all a team, and we are in this together! I am very excited about this new semester and look forward to the many weeks to come! ☺

What is Math 2? This semester we will study the following main topics: Transformations, Parallel Lines, Similarity, Triangle Congruence, Quadratic Functions, Radicals & Rational Exponents, Rational Functions & Modeling Variation, Triangle Trigonometry, and Probability.

Students will build skills in *critical thinking*, *problem solving*, *leadership*, and *collaboration*. Students will work collaboratively to model mathematics in applicable situations.

<u>Success in Honors Math 2:</u> Much of this course is about critical thinking and synthesizing information. You will have to think and analyze, not just follow a memorized process. You must do your part on the studying end, ask questions in class and come for extra help if needed, and keep up with your grade online.

Assessments: One or more quizzes will be given during each unit. The purpose of a quiz is to assess your understanding at that point in time. You should use your quiz(zes) to help you prepare for your tests. Please make sure you are asking for clarification on material *prior* to test day. Keep in mind math typically builds on itself as the semester progresses, so it is important that you do your best on each unit so you will be prepared for the next one.

<u>Homework:</u> Completing homework and studying as you go are <u>essential</u> to your success in this class. Homework will be assigned nearly every night and late work will NOT be accepted. **Students are encouraged to keep a running study guide that they add to each night after the daily assignment is completed.** Further information on this will be discussed in class. Homework grades will be recorded daily on the HW Stamp Sheet, which will be collected at the end of each unit to be recorded in PowerSchool.

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Course Expectations: Students will be expected to check Google Classroom daily, turn in all assignments on time, and stay engaged and respectful during the entire class period. <u>PowerSchool Grade Book:</u> All grades will be recorded in the PowerSchool electronic gradebook. It is the students' responsibility to keep updated on their progress in the class. To gain access to PowerSchool, contact Student Services. Once assignments are graded and recorded they will be returned to students. I likely will not post any grades until the first unit is complete so that the average will not be skewed by empty categories.

Remind/Emailing the Teacher: I will use Remind to send out messages periodically to remind students and parents about upcoming assessments, due dates, and posted grades. To receive messages via text, text @shunthm2 to 81010. You can opt-out of messages at any time by replying, 'unsubscribe @shunthm2. Or to receive messages via email, send an email to shunthm2@mail.remind.com. To unsubscribe, reply with 'unsubscribe' in the subject line. Remember that students who are emailing any teacher should do so from their WCPSS email account.

Google Classroom Website: I will give each class the code to sign up for this in class, and every student should join their class period's site. Announcements, review keys, optional practice, etc will be posted here.

<u>Weebly Public Website:</u> I will post assignments and quiz and test dates on the Weebly site so parents and students can see them without being logged in to the Google Classroom site. Do be aware that posted assignments are subject to change, so students should listen carefully in class to update this list if necessary.
